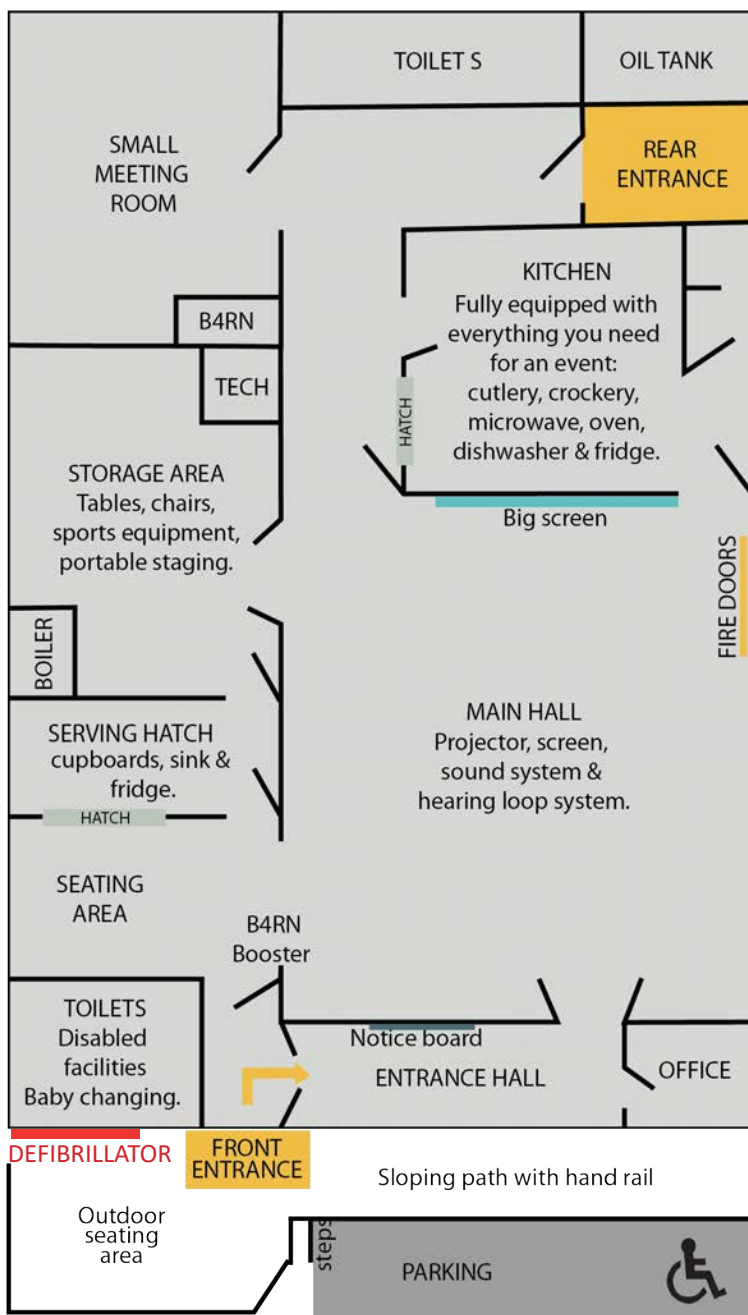

Here is a bit of historical information (there is more available in the church)

The Church was rebuilt in 1873 to replace the old Church. The opening ceremony was held in June 1873. In 1924, Old and New Hutton churches became a 'united benefice' when Rev. Greer took up residence in New Hutton. In 1930 the vicarage of Old Hutton was sold. The vestry window referred to in 'The History of Westmorland', published in 1885, states that a Mr Paley of Lancaster dates this window to be of the reign of Henry the VIII.

At a parish meeting in 1947, it was decided to ask permission for a 'memorial window' to be placed at the east end of the Church in memory of those who fell during World War II. Authority was given, and the window was dedicated in September 1948 by Canon Jones, Vicar of Kendal. The window was in memory of William Holmes and William Edge Marshall. The two windows in the north wall are to the memory of Thomas Fawcett and his wife. The window behind the choir stalls was given by Mrs Syddall in memory of her husband who was the headmaster of the village school from 1921 to 1936.

OLD HUTTON WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

Old Hutton has a thriving and very active WI which has been in existence in the village since 1923.

Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm at Old Hutton Public Hall, unless otherwise announced (see calendar).

Members come from a wide area including Old & New Hutton as well as Kendal. At the monthly meeting they have interesting speakers discussing a wide variety of topics. There are various outings and the opportunity to join in activities organised by the Cumbria-Westmorland Federation.

Members also organise the refreshments at annual litter-picks and quiz nights. New members are always made very welcome.

PARISH INTERNET 'B4RN' (Broadband for the Rural North)

From 2015 to 2019 volunteers from the parish and neighbouring parishes installed a B4RN network for every house and business in the parish. It provides world class connectivity and is faster and cheaper than broadband from any other provider.

Most of the houses and businesses in the parish now use B4RN. If you wish to be connected, please register your interest on the B4RN website and contact the parish clerk at ohpclerk@gmail.com

The clerk will arrange for a group of volunteers to lay the duct to your house or business at no cost. B4RN technicians will install the kit inside the house or business at a current cost of £150.

This well-established and committed group of volunteers need new recruits to assist the ambulance service in medical emergencies. With now only eight members there are no responders living in Old or New Hutton. The training provided by North West Ambulance Service (NWAS) is comprehensive and will give you the First Aid skills and confidence needed while waiting for the ambulance to arrive. Topics covered include cardio-pulmonary resuscitation, oxygen therapy and using a defibrillator.

The team meet monthly at The Crooklands Hotel and training is free. You need to be over 18, pass a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, and possess a clean driving licence.

We average 6 or 7 callouts per year between Old and New Hutton. We respond to the 999 calls and would be at an incident before an ambulance might get to you. In the case of an emergency please dial 999 and they will despatch the First Responder team as required.

Access to the Community Public Access Defibrillators (CPADs) can be gained when a member of the community witnesses a medical collapse and dials 999. The handler will give the caller the code to the box which houses the CPAD. NWAS know where the nearest CPAD is to a particular location.

KILLINGTON SAILING ASSOCIATION

The Killington Sailing Association is constituted as an “association of members” and would welcome “sailors” from Old Hutton.

Members can take part in dinghy sailing, canoeing, windsurfing or sailboarding. Most participants provide their own equipment, although there are a few club boats that can be hired. One member, a qualified sailing instructor, could be prepared to offer some training for beginners. Most individuals sail independently, but occasional “race days” are also organised.

There is an initial joining fee and subsequent annual fees (a fraction of those found on the bigger lakes).

Old Hutton residents and landowners have been granted exceptionally advantageous price concessions to fish on Killington Lake. The lake is stocked and managed by the Kent Angling Association, with coarse fishing and trout fishing according to the season. Residents and landowners within the parish are entitled to purchase annual permits to fish on Killington Reservoir at a cost of 50 pence for landowners and £5.00 for all other residents including children of any age.

PARISH MAGAZINE: The Grapevine, is now sent electronically monthly via the parish council list and from Rev Angela's list.

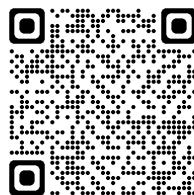

OLD HUTTON

Old Hutton is a scattered, rural community four miles from Kendal, with a population of just less than 300. The main hamlets of Middleshaw, St. John's and Bridge End are all situated along the B6254 from Kendal to Kirkby Lonsdale. There are several smaller hamlets and isolated farms, some dating from the Domesday Survey of 1086. Farming, once a significant occupation, now accounts for only a small proportion of employment.

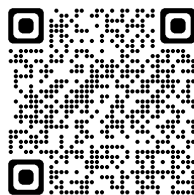
ARMISTEAD WINDFARM COMMUNITY FUND

The selected projects will be considered and the applicants will be asked to talk about their request at the next community fund meeting.

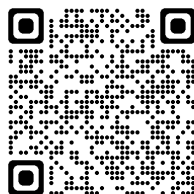

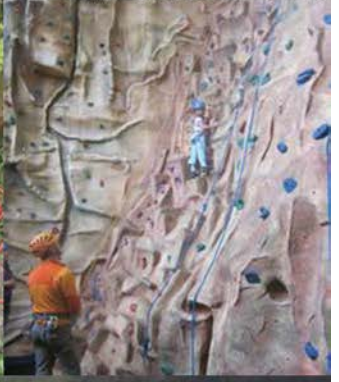

A BIT OF HISTORY: Interesting Millennium Historical topics

The Public Hall: In the few years running up to the Millennium, Parishes were being encouraged to take on special projects to note the arrival of the year 2000. At a general meeting in 1997 it was decided that upgrading the Public Hall should be our number one project.

Grants were being offered by the Lotteries Commission, but applicants had to show that they had sufficient local support and enthusiasm. A steering group was set up to design and cost etc the hall upgrade and develop activities that showed that we were worth supporting.

We set about running fund raising activities, a Promises Auction raised £3000, and more was added through regular smaller events. Then we were able to seek local grants showing that we had support locally (Freda Scott Trust, SLDC, Cumbria CC etc). That was all very encouraging, but, for our costs of £230,000 we needed the big one, The Lottery. We eventually made up the hall costs with all the smaller grants and finally a Lottery Grant of £182,000 in January 2000. The Hall was completely upgraded, enlarged and made up to date. It is now larger, dry, and warm with modern facilities and is much used.

Fellside Wood: This came out of the blue. We had a footpath group who used Countryside Commission grants to refurbish the key footpaths in the Parish. They then set up a Tree Group who were planning to plant trees for the Millennium. A sad family split at one of the farms left some land in the Parish unsold and the agent contacted the Woodland Trust who were seeking to plant 200 Millennium Community Woodlands around the country. They approached us and asked if we would be interested in a 13½ acre woodland, if the Woodland Trust thought there was the local commitment, and if we could help raise money to buy the land etc.

There definitely was enthusiasm for the wood in the village, as demonstrated at the public meetings, but we had this big mountain to climb to raise money for our village hall, with the likely costs seemingly increasing all the time. However, we did it, acting very much second fiddle to the Woodland Trust's professional fund-raiser. In fact, with £19,000 needed to be raised locally in South Lakeland, over £30,000 was eventually raised from local companies.

Starting in December 1999 over 9000 saplings were planted, leaving much of one of the fields as a wild flower meadow. The walkways were made deliberately broad for family walking.

Have you noticed the big **slabs of stone** beside the main pathway about half way down Fellside Wood? They were the suggestion of the primary school and should be called 'The Silent Stones'. They are supposed to represent the 'Scattered Community'. The slabs were donated by the quarry.

The Village bench: on Middleshaw Hill was carved and made by Nick Robinson, a local man, with the stone donated by Greaves Farm. Mrs Ruth Robinson had oak saplings planted on each side of the bench, they now look like healthy young trees.

Fabric of Old Hutton: A magnificent tapestry known as the 'Fabric of Old Hutton' hangs in the village church for all to see. This large and beautiful canvas work started in 1997 and was completed by the end of 1999. The idea was to produce a commemorative piece of work for the Millennium and encouraged a collective interest to show the talents and skills within the parish. The fabric consists of 484,000 embroidery stitches in 72 squares and worked on by more than 100 people aged from 3 to 98.

Cumbria Village of the Year 1999: Advised by Voluntary Action Cumbria, the village entered the 'Cumbria Village of the Year 1999' competition as it would look good for the Lottery application. We won and were then encouraged to enter the National competition with a tempting prize of £3000. This would have been used to help to tarmac the public car park next to the church. Regional and national judges visited exhibitions in the village hall and we were awarded Northern Region Village of the Year 1999. We were awarded £500 to be used on village projects.

Parish Map & Book: A superb colourful map of the Parish was created in 1999 with help from SLDC and BCTV (British Conservation Trust Volunteers). Most residents have by now received their free copy but there are plenty still available. "The Parish of Old Hutton and Holmescales, a millennium Survey" was produced by the late John Parker. Five hundred copies were produced and distributed in the community. Both the maps and the book copies are stored in the Village Hall, so ask any Hall committee member about them when at an event if you would like one if they are not already on display at an event.

Daffodils: With a grant of £250 from National Grid, 2000 Daffodils were planted along the verges of the main road through the village, which we now enjoy every Spring.

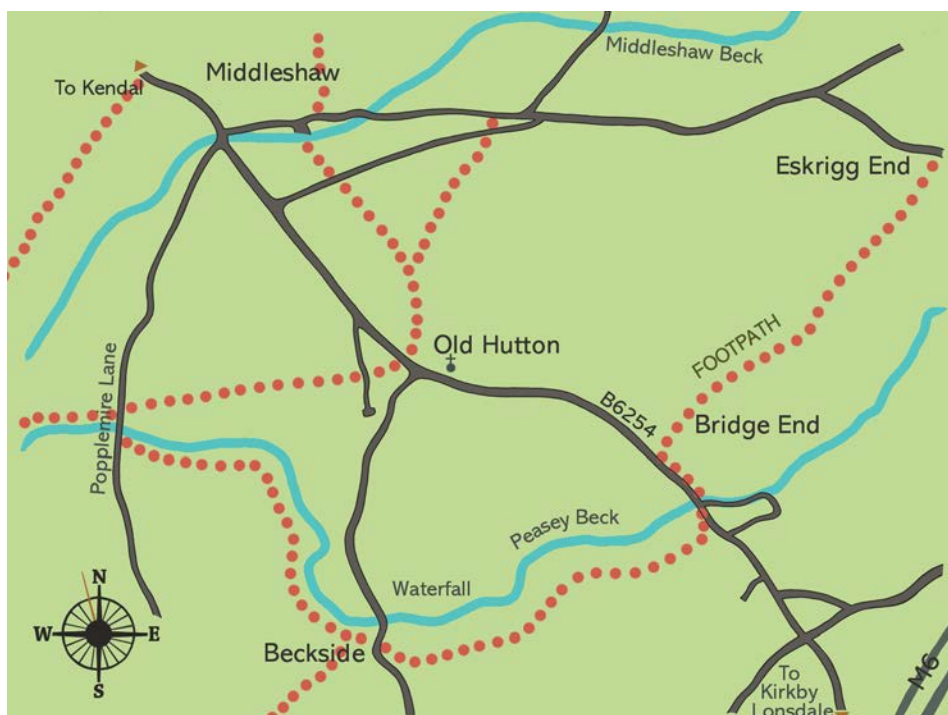
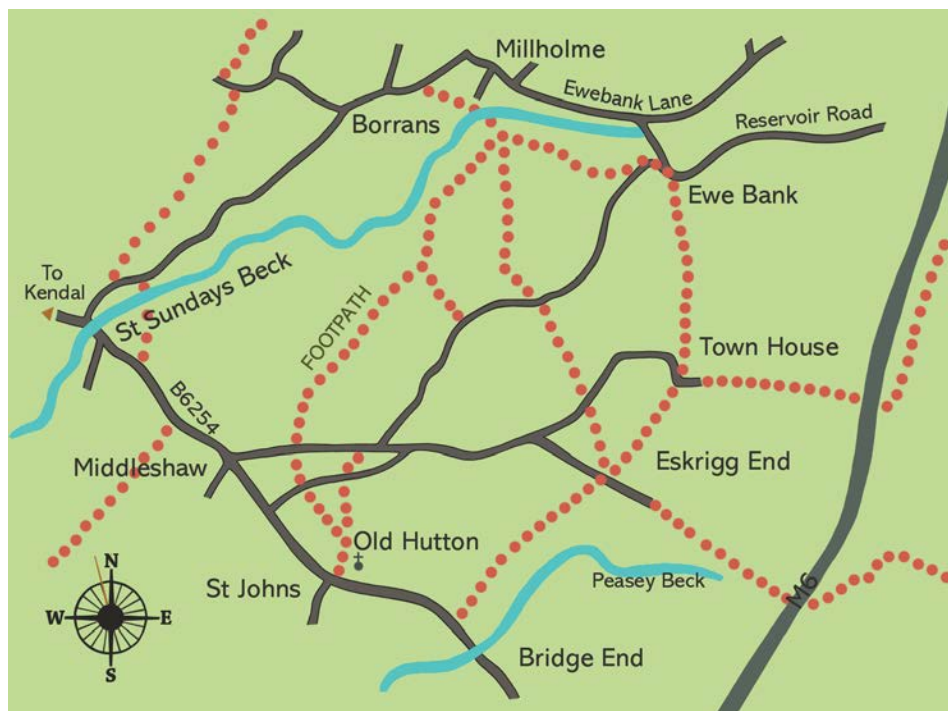
